4. Vice Presidential Address 8:28 PM Vice President Harvey delivers the Vice Presidential Address.

"Good evening everyone and welcome to Senate 9. A warm welcome to our fourteen new senators, and a welcome back to our returning senators as well.

I was reflecting on what I should say in my address, and my thoughts ultimately boiled down to this. If there is one thing I request of each and every one of you it is this: every time you step into this room, remember your mission and purpose as a senator at this school. It is easy for each of us to get wrapped up in the grandeur of an elected position or even the internal politics of our own campus- I'm a politics major like many of you- the temptation is very easy. But I believe that the majority of us in this room believe that our role is meaningful and purposeful. And there is a lot of good to be accomplished this year.

There has been a lot of positive change across our campus over the past couple of years. Over the past two years, our university has welcomed a new President, a new Chaplain in Campus Ministry, and most recently, a new Athletics Director. With new leadership, the campus has seen many fabulous developments with multiple building projects underway, a newly completed dining facility, the redesigning of the Pryzbyla Center, and the development of a Nursing Building which will hopefully be completed in a matter of months. In addition to these positive developments, the campus has also undergone recent struggles with a tragic incident occurring on our campus this summer. Despite these incidents, DPS under the leadership of Major McClean has taken active steps to ensure the safety of our students is a top priority.

And as our campus continues to grow and change this year and the next, it becomes our responsibility to keep our ear to the student body. I encourage you to set realistic expectations for yourselves this year- do not think you have to develop the resolution of the year. Often, the best of resolutions are not earth-shattering ideas but are simple, creative solutions that will benefit our campus community even if others do not take notice. Yesterday, it was the feast day of St. Therese of Lisieux, the Little Flower. She reminds each of us that, "Nothing is insignificant in the eyes of God." And this remains true for each of us, so remain focused on the tasks at hand. So work hard, treat others with respect, seek feedback, and serve with humility at all times. There is little else I could emphasize.

Now, a few practical things that will affect you all:

Note passing is an acceptable practice, but I ask that you keep it to only essential communication. There will be opportunities to hear from administrative officials throughout the semester aheadthis was a practice instituted by President Fahey last year, and one that I plan to continue this year. We will have our first senate speaker at the following meeting on October 23rd. Please feel free to communicate with me on any matter- I encourage senators to be honest and upfront with me about anything related to legislation, meetings, and procedure.

To close, I look forward to getting to know many of you better, and I hope to encourage you in your various pursuits throughout this year. Thank you and welcome again!"

#### C. Senator Michael Kish, Class of 2026 (Resolution 001) 8:54 PM

i. A Resolution to Show Support for Traditional Liturgy

## Vice President Harvey reads Resolution 001.

Senator Kish is recognized to go to the podium and give his speech.

"President Harvey, esteemed Senators, and honored members of the gallery, I'd like to begin by thanking all of you for being here tonight. It is no light undertaking to make posters, give speeches, shake down strangers for votes, and work for an uncertain undertaking, which carries with it two possible consequences: either you are fortunate, and you are <u>not</u> elected, which means you have free Monday nights and carry neither shame nor burden of expectation, or you <u>are</u> elected, which is both sentence and reward.

If you are sitting as a Senator tonight, you are subject to grave expectations: You are expected to collaborate, expected to produce beneficial legislation; and you are *required* to retain the virtue of humility. This is an element of leadership that is as critical as it is exceptionally difficult. Now, I know what you're thinking: Senator Kish, *you* struggle with humility? I know this will shock many of you, but the answer is, well, yes. Before I continue to the action, I would just like to ask everyone in this room to keep all of SGA in their prayers, that they may undertake their duties with the courage and cunning of St. Joan of Arc, but with the humility, fidelity, and good humor of the Little Flower, St. Therese of Lisieux.

On to the real deal- thank you for indulging me. The legislation you have before you is one particularly close to my heart for many reasons, but mostly because I took Latin in high school and I don't want to forget it. As noted in my second 'whereas' clause, President Kilpatrick expressed an interest for the Latin Novus Ordo to appear on campus. I, along with many others, have long desired to have an available Mass in this fashion on Campus. There are three major reasons why I advocate for this now.

First, because it is a beautiful form of the Mass. We Catholics attend the Novus Ordo every Sunday, and are often familiar with its rhythm, style, and structure. The fact that many Catholics on this campus have been doing this for so long means in some ways we've gotten too used to it. This is a traditional, historical, and reverent way to celebrate a familiar Mass in the same language that it has been celebrated in for millennia.

Second, because Pope Leo XIII told us to. When the Catholic University was established in 1887, he asked us to retain and propagate the sound doctrine of the Church. The Latin Novus Ordo is fully approved by Pope Francis, as well as Cardinal Gregory on behalf of the Archdiocese of Washington.

Third, because it bridges a gap. Not everybody is fully comfortable going to a Tridentine Latin Mass, in the same way that not everybody is fully comfortable going to an English Novus Ordo Mass. We want to create a middle ground between these two options so that all will be able to become comfortable with the language's usage in the Mass, supplemented by familiar forms and faces celebrating it.

I have met with Fr. Bernard, and corresponded with Fr. Aquinas. Both have approved this Mass on campus. Since SGA has literally no power over Campus Ministry... among other things... I have structured this resolution to be simply 'in support' of this addition. While no official date or frequency has been set, Campus Ministry is happy to involve a Latin Novus Ordo on campus, alongside student support, which I hope to provide.

Thank you for considering this resolution, and I hope you all will support this wonderful exercise of our first amendment rights."

- End of **Senator Kish's** speech

**Senator Paulson** rises to ask about the lack of clarity. She asks what the resolution is supporting and suggests an amendment, claiming the interpretation is interesting.

**Senator Kish** says that the Novus Ordo is complicated and the resolution does not need to be specific. He emphasizes that the intention of the resolution is to support what the students want, which is to preserve tradition.

Senator Paulson says it's interesting that he left out specific language.

Senator Kish claims it is not pertinent and that it has to do with those in administration.

**Senator Suarez** says thank you for bringing this resolution to the table. She offers her full support and asks if the intention is to offer traditional Latin Mass, why not full Latin Mass? She also asks why not other languages, and if there will be language guidance for students during the Mass.

**Senator Kish** points out that the Archbishop has called for more inclusive liturgy, an issue that is beyond the committee. He proposes that we could practice other languages as well having an Italian, Spanish, or Universal Mass. We should use the same missiles because they contain the same prayers of Novus Ordo, making it easier to follow the full latin mass in this way.

**Senator Michels** exclaims that all masses are a little different. He reminds the committee that the Domicans on campus speak latin. Who better to give latin mass? The Senator ends by asking how many masses would be like this, what are the divisions?

**Senator Kish** says that it is up to the acting preacher to decide the different elements and divisions of a latin mass. He explains how it is really not that different, just different ways of preserving language, tradition, and emotion in mass. Not every mass on campus would now be a latin mass, and masses in English would not be taken away as well. Finally, Campus Ministry has asked for flexibility on the issue.

**Senator Graf** asks if this latin mass would replace English mass or if additional masses would be offered.

**Senator Kish** explains he is not sure, but thinks English masses would not be replaced. In doubt, we could ask Fr. Bernard who is in charge of the coordination.

Senator D'Albero asks how the resolution would affect latin used in English masses.

Senator Kish does not know.

Motion to vote by Senator Gehrig seconded by Senator D'Attelo.
