A Resolution Allowing Students in Isolation to Receive Mail

Whereas,

Students living on campus who test positive for COVID-19 are required to move into an isolation residence room in The Mills-South Residence Hall.

Whereas,

These students are provided food and other resources throughout their period of isolation, but do not receive any of their incoming mail or packages.

Whereas,

Living in isolation can be very stressful and students may need certain things that they did not originally bring with them.

Whereas,

The Spring 2021 plan for return to campus will include an even greater use of the isolation residence hall, so more students will be in this situation in the future.

Whereas,

Many family members may want to send care packages or cards to the students who have been placed in isolation and would mail those to the student's P.O. Box.

Whereas,

Students are notified by email when they have received mail or packages and they are ready to be picked up.

Be it enacted that,

The Student Government Association Senate, acting in its official capacity as the representative of the undergraduate student body of The Catholic University of America, hereby requests that students who are moved to an isolation residence room can receive their mail by notifying Residence Life in The Mills-South after they have received a mail room notification.
