***Whereas,***

Opus Hall opened in January 2009 and is one of the on-campus housing options for upperclassmen students.

***Whereas,***

The building is home to over 400 undergraduate male and female students. Therefore, Opus Hall is the most occupied residence hall on campus.

***Whereas,***

Currently, there are no printers located in any on-campus residence halls that are available to students.

***Whereas,***

Printing options available to the student body are located in the Mullen Library, the Information Desk in the Edward J. Pryzbyla University Center (Pryz) and Leahy Hall.

***Whereas,***

Leahy Hall is the only spot on campus that offers 24/7 printing since it is home to the Department of Public Safety.

***Whereas,***

Opus Hall is the farthest residency hall from Leahy Hall, making many students weary to make the walk in the dark across campus to use.

***Whereas,***

In past years, the University has had printers in residence halls like Millenium Residency Halls and Centennial Village (CV).

***Whereas,***

Other universities that The Catholic University of America commonly compares itself to: University of Loyola Maryland and Fairfield University have printers in all/some of their residence halls.

***Be it enacted that,***

The Student Government Association Senate, acting in its official capacity as the representative of the undergraduate student body of The Catholic University of America, hereby requests the university install a printer into Opus Hall that all residents of the building have access to.
