Resolution 006 A Resolution to Ensure the Cleanliness of Ventilation Systems in On-Campus Dormitories Sponsored by: Senator Kish Co-Sponsored by: Senator Bert, Senator Curioso

Whereas,

There have been numerous reports of *Stachybotrys Chartarum*, commonly known as "Black Mold" present in Flather Hall, Ryan Hall, and Regan Hall.

Whereas,

The dormitories on campus are a crucial element of University life, both housing students and serving as common gathering places.

Whereas,

The symptoms of "Black Mold Poisoning" are serious, affecting particularly the immunocompromised and those suffering from preexisting infections, colds, viruses, and other debilitating medical conditions.

Whereas,

We are entering the winter season where students typically seem to see an increase in illness and flu-like symptoms making them even more susceptible to be affected by mold.

Whereas,

Moisture in the dorms is a significant cause of the development of Black Mold.

Whereas,

Air Dehumidifiers are typically and changing out air conditioning filters is a typical remedy for excessive moisture.

Whereas,

Due to the amount of mold being noticed, students report a slow and laborious process when having their rooms inspected, prolonging those suffering from other illnesses and side effects from continual mold exposure.

Be it enacted that:

The Student Government Association Senate, acting in its official capacity as the representative of the undergraduate student body of The Catholic University of America, hereby requests that:

- 1. Timely and professional inspections are conducted in all dormitory buildings on campus where *Stachybotrys Chartarum*, "Black Mold", is reported.
 - a. If "Black Mold" is discovered, it must be removed and the room cleaned in a timely manner.

- 2. Upon report, the Air Conditioning Systems in the Flather, Ryan, and Regan dorms are inspected.
 - a. If found to be inadequate, they are to be repaired or replaced in a timely manner.
- 3. Air Dehumidifiers are put in areas where there is significant humidity present.
- 4. Information about how to fill out a proper work order is reinforced by Resident Assistant (RA) and to students and posted in common areas of residence halls.
 - a. Stickers and/or Magnets printed with a QR code that leads to the work order request form are created and distributed to students.
 - b. Posters with Work Order Form information and guides to filling out a work order are created and posted visibly in all on campus residence halls.
 - c. An email is sent to all University members living on campus by their RA with information on how to fill out a work order request, and the next steps that the University Facilities Department takes once these requests are received.
